As part of the ongoing maintenance of the Clubhouse and Marina it is now time to replace the Piling. Following many hours of discussions and consultation we have instructed Walcon Marine. They will be lifting out all the

Current Marina Piles and replacing them with steel tubes. The work will commence in early March and should take approximately three weeks. We hope to keep any disruption to a minimum and Members with boats currently moored will be contacted separately with



regard to moving boats around within the marina.

The dredging is scheduled to start on 11th April and again we hope disruption will be kept to a minimum
